In these stressful times, stepping away from daily demands and immersing in Jamaica's natural beauty and relaxed culture creates the ideal space for deep reflection, strategic thinking, and visionary planning. This retreat is designed to foster the Praxis retreat objectives and seeks to realign with the mission, strengthen collective strategy, and develop actionable plans for the future. Through intentional engagement with influential Jamaican grassroots leaders, Maroon community principles, and historical insights, participants will gain fresh perspectives, sharpen their focus, and return reinvigorated to lead with clarity and purpose.



CTWO Praxis Retreat Agenda:

Cost: \$2,500pp includes all meals, in-country transportation, activities, local guide, and accommodations. The <u>cost does not include</u> flights, travelers' insurance, nor passport fees.

Day 1: Kingston

Group arrives to Kingston Norman Manley Airport (KIN)

Transportation to the hotel is provided 3pm check into the <u>Pegasus Hotel</u> located in New Kingston, an up-and-coming area in the city that has parks, restaurants, and cafes 7pm Group Dinner

Day 2: Kingston

8:00am Breakfast is included and provided at the hotel and/or villa each morning 9:00am Visit with JCADV (Jamaica Coalition Against Domestic Violence) the organization that helped establish the first confidential shelter for survivors of domestic violence. Day 3: Portland Parish, San San

9:00am Early 2-hour drive to Portland Parish to check into Norse Hill Estate 12:00pm Visit to <u>Winnifred Beach</u>, the only public access beach in Portland Parish and one the community maintains and defends against development and government aggression. We will have a brief talk with members of the <u>Free</u> <u>Winnifred Beach Benevolent Society</u> and enjoy the beach and natural spring 5:00-8:00pm Return to the villa for Praxis Retreat Agenda

Day 4: Maroon Day

9:00 am Depart to "Nanny Town" aka <u>Moore</u> <u>Town</u> (UNESCO) and then 1:00pm visit to <u>Charles Town</u> Maroon Community to learn about and experience the African based Maroon culture, history and means for sustaining Black sovereignty and independence for over 150 years. Our visits include a traditional drum and dance lesson, museum visit, and conversations with community. A traditional Maroon lunch with the community provided.
